### From the Desk of Fr. Leo

God calls whom He freely chooses. In this instance David, the youngest of all Jesse's sons, to be king of Israel. God's choice is always His own doing. Also, in each individual instance and external qualities it does not influence Him. The disposition of the heart is what counts.

In the rite of consecration, oil is used. High priests were anointed as were the kings of Israel. Through it, in a certain way, the king became a sharer in God's holiness, and his person considered inviolable. Anointing with oil symbolized God's Spirit taking possession of him. Christ, the new



David, was anointed not with the mere symbol but with the Spirit Himself, and likewise are all who are incorporated into Him in baptism. Hence the anointing with chrism. While doing so, the priest says: "as Christ was anointed priest, prophet and king, so may you live always as members of His body, sharing everlasting life.

In the Second Reading, the Christian's life is one of light in Christ. He is to put aside all former evil habits. The fruits of light are beneficial to all. Evil deeds will stand condemned in the face of this light. A section of an ancient Christian hymn refers to the Risen Christ who brings humankind from spiritual death to the light of life in Himself.

In the Gospel this weekend, we hear of an example of a splendid victory of Light over darkness. As sheer drama, this trial scene is brilliant, rich in tragic irony. Not merely is it the beggar who is rejected, but Christ the Light. In the setting, a current view is repudiated: personal ailments are not always the consequence of personal sins. Jesus gives the purpose not the cause of the blindness; that is in order that God can manifest His wonderful works. Jesus Himself is the Light of the world; He has come to give light to humankind, taking away his blindness, not only physical but also spiritual blindness.

Those who refuse to accept the Light remain in spiritual blindness. It is Christ who pronounces judgment. For many, the result of Christ's divine mission is tragedy, through their own pride and willful blindness.

With the constant change that is occurring around us, the Diocese has added some new protocols in the week.


- All social gatherings that can be rescheduled, postponed or cancelled, should be.
