

## From the Desk of Fr. Leo

When anyone works for a definite end, there is genuine rejoicing when the goal is reached: the student at his or her graduation, the scientist at his or her new invention, the soldier on the day of victory, the laborer at the completion of a definite task, parents in the successful accomplishments of their children. Success crowns the long and arduous toil. People are glad and make merry.

This weekend's feast celebrates the exaltation of Christ at the Fathers side, sharing his dignity, power and glory, he the King and heir of the universe. The entire Christian world has followed him from his taking human flesh of the Virgin Mother by the power of the Holy Spirit until he was crucified for our sake on Golgotha. Every endeavor to live our Christian commitment within the bounds of or own individual calling, be it ever so insignificant in the eyes of humankind, will receive ample reward from the King of kings and Lord of lords. For God will never be outdone in generosity.


