

The Nativity of the Lord

December 25, 2018

From the Desk of Fr. Leo

In a neighborhood school, a class of children with learning disabilities was presenting a Christmas play for the PTA. The production had three acts. The opening scene was at Nazareth, with the decree of Caesar Augustus; the next was at Bethlehem with the refusal of the innkeeper; and finally, the manger site in the hill country. The faculty and parents were anxious about the children's abilities to perform, but the first act went just fine.

In the second act Joseph and Mary knocked on the door of the inn and were quickly refused by the little innkeeper, with the words: "There is no room." They pleaded again very sorrowfully and he hesitated a bit but then said his lines: "There is no room." The script called for one more plea and refusal and this time the dejected couple begged for a room with all their hearts. The little innkeeper began his refusal but could not continue. He broke down and sobbed: "You can have my room." The teacher quickly got the play back on track, but the audience was visibly touched by the innocent spontaneity of this caring little child. In him, they saw demonstrated the true meaning of Christmas.

All of us to some degree play the role of innkeeper. We accept or reject others. Are we more like the original innkeeper who turned them out into the lonely night or the small child who welcomed them? Perhaps we hang "No Vacancy" signs around us by our rude words, gestures or tones of voices – telling others we don't want to be bothered; we're too busy or tired. If we are the exclusive type, catering only to the better class of people, the chances are that we could have turned away Joseph and Mary – and in doing that we would have also rejected Jesus, hidden within.

Some people are strictly unbending, while others believe that there's always room for one more. Can we make an exception in an exceptional situation, like that of Jesus, Mary and Joseph?

It is said of St. Theresa of Kolkata, who has helped perhaps a half a million people die with a bit of dignity, that she always makes room for one more. Don't you wonder what Jesus was thinking of in later life when He said, "Whatsoever you do for others you do for Me"? Could He have been reflecting back to the day of His birth and the rejection scene at the Bethlehem Inn?

Christmas is the traditional season of giving, but the better gifts are not the material ones. A true and beautiful present for another is a bit of our time when we think there's none to spare, a little advice and direction if we are so blessed and another is in need.
