

### From the Desk of Fr. Leo

Moses called a special meeting for his elders, where they were to receive a unique outpouring of God's spirit so that they could prophesy. Two of the elders, Eldad and Medad, missed the meeting but still got the spirit. At this Joshua, Moses' aide, complained and asked him to declare the spirit invalid. But Moses would not. He said he only wished more people had the spirit of God. He was not concerned with how they got it but was simply glad they had it. In other words, he said, don't impose limitations on what God can do or how He must do it. This is the message of the First Reading.

The Gospel Reading is similar. St John told Jesus that there was a man using His holy name to expel demons. Because "he is not our company," St. John said, "we tried to stop him." Jesus, like Moses, did not want the man stopped, He said, "anyone who is not against us is with us."

We owe a reverent respect to our Church with its rules and ways of worship, and members should observe them. We are glad that God is present to us, but we should not say that He is absent to others just because they do not belong "to our company." Churches should not engage in this quarrel of who is right and who is wrong, but should acknowledge the differences and accept those who are not opposing us as being for us. Both the Old and New Testaments (Moses and Jesus) present this balanced style of Ecumenism.

If various Christian denominations are to work together, it's vital that we live in unison with our own members. It would be wrong for Catholic charismatics therefore to think that they relate to God in a more perfect way than other Catholics. It is likewise wrong for "Council of Trent" traditionalists to envision their way as the only way for Catholic worship. If we are truly Spirit people, we'll have the spirit of love and peaceful cooperation. If we are really traditionalists, we'll go to the source of tradition where Jesus taught us to be accepting of others.

We must be skeptical of those who say there is but one way to do anything- especially in religion. There are thousands of ways to live, work, find God and worship Him. There are many roads to heaven with various "companies" along the way providing needed help and good directions. We are to worship as we see fit and respect others who believe and worship differently. Such is commanded by Jesus (and Moses). The many diversities on earth have not been produced only by men and women. God has created, by His own free choice, a world full of varieties; demonstrating that He doesn't think in terms of only one way.
