

From the Desk of Fr. Leo

Do you remember the old commercial: "Wonder bread builds strong bodies 12 ways"? It's a good example of the advertising technique called "implied uniqueness." The implication is that the other breads do not build strong bodies 12 ways – although probably they do, for they are all basically the same.

This weekend on the Feast of the Precious Body and Blood of Christ or Corpus Christi, we proudly present the "Wonder Bread of the Altar," making mighty claims about what this sacred Bread is and does. The Church is not using the technique of "implied uniqueness" but is saying outright: this is the Bread that came down from Heaven, and it is unique for it is the Body of Christ.

The Holy Eucharist is an honored memorial of the Risen Christ, who at the Last Supper both announced His departure from this world and promised to remain in the breaking of the Bread. The Church sees Eucharistic overtones in other scriptural passages, in Jesus' multiplication of the loaves to feed the multitude, and even in the manna, the bread from heaven, that Moses and the Israelites gathered on the Exodus in the 12th century B.C.

This religious Wonder Bread has a rich and ancient history and is unique in its ability to fashion healthy Christian lives, in 12 ways and many more. Frequent reception of Holy Communion has long been advocated as a singular way to spiritual advancement. The tiny grains of wheat from which the Bread is made were buried in the teeming earth like Christ, and then rose up to new life.

Precisely how Jesus is present in the Bread has been a centuries-old controversy, which unfortunately still divides the various Christian churches. Catholics profess a real and permanent presence; Presbyterians and Methodists understand it more in a figurative sense; some Lutherans follow a middle course and see the presence as real but temporary. Some see the presence in the Bread, others in the believers. In ecumenical pursuits most Protestants say that Communion is a "means" to achieve unity with a person of another denomination, and encourage intercommunion. Catholics see it as a "sign" of complete unity achieved, and therefore do not favor intercommunion.

We could improve unity between God and humanity and among people and religions in general if we could make Jesus more present in our daily lives especially after we have received Holy Communion. If we profess the Real Presence, and in Holy Communion accept the Lord into our lives, then Jesus should be visible in us to all we meet.




